# RCDP (Riverside County Democratic Party) Report July 20, 2022 Sheila Kay Riley

### A. General Information

- a. RCDP Chair, Tisa Rodriguez, reported on the July 8<sup>th</sup>, 9<sup>th</sup>, and 10<sup>th</sup> CADEM E-board Meeting.
- b. RCDP Vice-Chair, Agi Kessler, also reported on the July 8<sup>th</sup>, 9<sup>th</sup>, and 10<sup>th</sup> CADEM e-board Meeting and focused on the results of the CADEM Resolutions Committee and votes taken by the CADEM e-board.

### B. Endorsement Coordinator

- a. Filing for the <u>non-partisan</u> elections begins Monday, July 18<sup>th,</sup> 2022 and concludes at the close of business on Friday, August 12<sup>th</sup>, 2022 unless the incumbent for that race hasn't qualified and then there's an extension (except for the incumbent) until close of business, Wednesday, August 17<sup>th</sup>, 2022.
- b. Chartered area Democratic Clubs need to be actively recruiting Democrats registered for 90 days as Democrats prior to approximately August 20<sup>th</sup>, 2022 to run for office. Anyone interested can contact Sheila Kay Riley (<a href="mailto:sheilaandruss@aol.com">sheilaandruss@aol.com</a>) to see what races they might live in and want to seek office.
- c. Sheila Kay Riley provides to RCDP AD Chairs, AD Secretaries, RCDP Officers, and others who subscribe to the information for the Endorsement process.
  - i. Races on the ballot
  - ii. Incumbents and party of registration
  - iii. Candidates, party of registration, and contact information and notes when candidates have qualified.
- d. Contest Every Race in conjunction with CADEM
  - i. Detailed lists (prepared by RCDP Chair, Tisa Rodriguez, and RCDP Endorsement Coordinator, Sheila Kay Riley) of a total of 7 governing bodies' races were sent to the CADEM to be utilized. It appears that there has been some texting recruiting for other than those races in areas where the CADEM was instructed not to text.
  - ii. Anyone who receives a text to consider running for office should contact Tisa Rodriguez (<a href="mailto:chair.rcdp@gmail.com">chair.rcdp@gmail.com</a>) in order to ensure that texts are only going out as designated by the RCDP.

### C. AD 58 Caucus Chair

- a. Sheila Kay Riley serves as the Caucus Chair
- b. The Caucus has had one "organization meeting" and the 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter Meeting will be held within approximately 20 days to plan in detail our Caucus' Endorsement Work.
- c. Initial Endorsement Recommendation Interviews will occur during Saturday, August 20<sup>th</sup>, 2022 and Sunday, August 21<sup>st</sup>, 2022 for all non-partisan races in which there's a Democratic candidate(s) who wishes to be endorsed and the race has not gone into extension and the race is in all or part of AD 58. No date has yet been set for endorsement recommendation interviews in which the race goes into extension.
- d. These are open meetings and information is posted on the RCDP website. Club leaders will be invited to provide recommendations for the endorsements.
- e. Sheila coordinated a meeting of AD 58 Chair and Secretary and AD 63 Chair and Secretary to discuss where their races will overlap in order to have as smooth as possible endorsement recommendation process. A follow up meeting is planned.
- D. Club Engagement/Council of Clubs Committee Chair
  - a. Sheila is the new Chair of this Committee and the Committee is getting started in its work.
  - b. Sheila and Tisa Rodriguez, RCDP Chair, had a telephonic conference in which they outlined goals and plans.
  - c. Committee Members have been asked via e-mail to provide dates when they can not meet so that we can schedule our future meetings.
  - d. Club Presidents have been asked via email to provide when their club meetings and e-board meetings occur so to not schedule the upcoming monthly meetings.
