- Following the Russian **invasion of Ukraine**, they worked to **strengthen NATO**, reached out to our allies and restored our relationship with them.
- President Biden made it clear that **if Russia defeats Ukraine, the next target will be NATO** nations. *'Tiss better to send bullets than the bodies of U.S. service people.*
- Sixteen of the **world's most notable economists** – all **Nobel Prize winners** – note how the **economy and foreign policy are interwoven**. They warn us about foreign policy issues if Donald Trump is elected. They state that among the **most important determinants of economic success are the rule of law and economic and political certainty**. For a country like the U.S., which is embedded in deep relationships with other countries, **conforming to international norms and having normal and stable relationships with other countries is also an imperative**. Donald Trump and the vagaries of his actions and policies threaten this stability and the U.S.'s standing in the world.

TRUMP on FOREIGN POLICY

Cruelty – Authoritarianism - Fascism

- Trumps foreign policy is a much more **transaction approach** that that of his predecessors. (Time: 4/30/2024)
- **Aligns himself with dictators/strongmen (North Korea, China, Hungary, Russia, etc.)**.
- Has said he **opposes NATO and that Russia "could do whatever the Hell they want"** to a NATO country he believes doesn't spend enough on collective defense. (Time: 4/30/2024)
- Claimed that the invasion of Ukraine wouldn't have happened had he been President. He would end the war on "day one." After Victor **Orban**, President of Hungary, visited Mar-a-Lago in March, he **said Trump 'wouldn't give a penny' to Ukraine if elected.** (Time: 4/30/2024)
- He **might not come to the aid of an attacked ally** in Europe or Asia if he felt that country wasn't paying enough for its own defense (Time: 4/30/2024)
- Has suggested that the U.S. could "withdraw its forces" from South Korea. (Time: 4/30/2024)
