

## PROTECT THE VOTE: WHAT TO DO WHEN YOU SEE VOTING IMPACTED

### DOCUMENT AND REPORT

**1. Document:** Write down what happened and how it has negatively impacted a voter's ability to cast their vote. Include as much detailed information as possible.

- Who: Identify who was impacted by the issue. This could be an individual voter, a group of voters, or an entire polling place.
- When: When did the issue take place?
- Where: Note the specific location of the polling place or drop box. Provide the address if possible. Example: "Vote Center at George Washington Middle School. 1234 Chery St. Sacramento 95812"

**2. Report:** Report all voting-related issues to the Voter Protection Hotline: 1 (877) 321-8683

### ISSUES TO REPORT

#### Logistical Issues:

- Polls/Vote Centers opening late/closing early
- Polling machine malfunctions
- Long lines
- Ballot supply issues

#### Voter Protection Issues:

- Electioneering within 100 feet
- Voter intimidation
- Challenges to voters
- Federal interference

### I.C.E., NATIONAL GUARD, FEDERAL TROOPS AT POLLS

In the event you observe ICE agents, National Guard, Federal Troops, or anyone armed or in uniform at polling locations, it should be reported to the Voter Protection Hotline immediately.

#### DO:

- Report: Immediately move to a safe distance and report to the Voter Protection Hotline (1-877-321-VOTE (8683))
- Observe: *From a safe distance*, observe and document.

#### DO NOT:

- Speak to, engage, or interfere with their activities. ALWAYS BE SAFE!
